HOPE

Dear Friends in Christ,

I WAIT FOR THE LORD, MY WHOLE BEING WAITS, AND IN HIS WORD I PUT MY HOPE As we enter the Season of Advent, my thoughts turn to a verse which we read recently in church. Nearing the end of his life, Paul wrote:

"Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing." (2 Timothy 4:8)

"Advent" and "appearing" are closely related in meaning. The first Advent refers to when Jesus was born in Bethlehem. Scripture teaches us that Jesus is eternal, so his birth was not his beginning. Rather, it was when he appeared on earth in human form. We call that his incarnation.

Advent Season is intended to be a time when we reflect on the true meaning of Christmas and prepare our hearts to worship the newborn King. Allowing ourselves to get too busy with baking, shopping and all the other festivities

can easily rob us of the joy of Christmas.

However, Paul's words in the verse above are not referring to Jesus' birth. Rather, they point us to the Second Advent, when Jesus will appear again. Paul was longing for that day. He knew that he had been faithful to his Lord, and he was anticipating being rewarded, according to Jesus' promise recorded in Matthew 16:27:

"For the Son of Man is going to come in his Father's glory with his angels, and then he will reward each person according to what they have done."

Paul was not just longing for a reward from his Master. He was longing to see Jesus come back in power and glory to establish his Kingdom and usher in a new heaven and a new earth.

We don't hear many sermons on the Second Coming of Christ. Perhaps that's an indication that we are happy as things are now and are in no hurry to see it all end. But end it will, at some point. We don't know God's timetable. Jesus could come today! Or he may not come for another thousand years. We know that Jesus' first coming was on schedule, as Paul wrote in Galatians 4:4-5:

"But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship."

We can be sure that his Second Coming will also be on time. The long wait is not an indication of any uncertainty on God's part. Rather, as Peter explained in 2 Peter 3:9:

"The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead, he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance."

As we go through this Season of Advent, let's remind ourselves of these truths. May our hearts not just long for Christmas, but like Paul may we also long for the day when Jesus will come again.
