Before our meeting officially began, we listened to a proposal from Warren Maddox regarding providing space for an Out of the Cold Shelter with 10 beds per night until late April. It would open at approximately 8 pm or 9 pm until 7 or 7:30 am. Staff and security would be provided, and any damages would be covered. Also, they have a cleaner who would come in each day and clean after everyone has left.

The vestry of St. John the Evangelist Church met on January 25, 2024, at 7 pm. The Ven. Paul Ranson opened the meeting with prayer. Present were The Ven. Paul Ranson, Bill MacKenzie, Nancy Stephens, Ben Mersereau, Carol Jones, Donna Price, Jeanne Sayre, Steve Hart, Michael Clark, Dennis Williams, and Joan Dunphy.

A discussion was held regarding the presentation by Warren Maddox. Moved by Steve that we accept the shelter on a 9 pm to 8 am or 7 am basis when required, seconded by Michael. Carried.

Additional Items for the Agenda – church credit card - New Business; demolition estimate, church organ and pews – Church Properties. Moved by Jeanne, seconded by Ben that the agenda be approved as amended. Carried.

Approval of Minutes of Last Vestry Meeting – Moved by Dennis, seconded by Nancy that the minutes be approved as read. Carried.

Correspondence – Ian Robertson re moving the stone church. He is wondering where things are right now. He feels we should consider putting a new roof on the building. We haven't received a written reply from the city regarding Positive Heart Living using the building, as a consultant's report needs to be done. Steve will get back to him.

Business Arising – Chair cleaning – Nancy obtained quotes from Servicemaster, Citrus Wow and Crystal Clean Maintenance. Servicemaster quoted \$20/chair; Citrus Wow - \$10/chair, Scotchguard extra \$499, 20 office chairs \$580; Crystal Clean \$735. Citrus Wow has A+ Better Business Bureau and good google reviews; Servicemaster – good google reviews. Moved by Nancy that we contract Citrus Wow to do 100 upholstered chairs with Scotchguard, seconded by Dennis. Carried.

Update on Sign Label – we should be receiving this next week.

Update on Quote for new AV PC – Moved by Dennis, seconded by Steve that we purchase a Mac Mini, to be paid by Willing Wonders, at a cost of \$1400. Carried.

Update on quote for water heater rental – we haven't received this yet.

Committee Reports

Finance and Admin – will meet February 6th to plan budget for the new year.

Youth and Seniors – no report

Treasurer's Report – we had a surplus of \$59,452. See Ben's report attached. Moved by Ben, seconded by Michael, that the Treasurer's Report be approved. Carried.

Church Properties – We have lost many more shingles from the roof because of the windstorm. Paul feels we should shut the gas off for safety purposes. We have decided to table this for the time being.

Demolition – Dennis phoned five contractors. Three said they are not interested because of time constraints. Monteith should have a bid by mid-February; Simpson – nothing yet; King Construction – nothing yet.

Organ and pews – Dennis contacted all organ specialists in New Brunswick. All of them are only interested in pipe organs. He is still waiting to hear from a couple of people. As far as the pews, he will contact some people in the parish to see if they are interested in having them. We might have some use for them in this building.

Willing Wonders – see fund report attached.

Worship – Lent starts February 14. We are going to host Maundy Thursday for area churches. Easter morning sunrise we are going to Killarney Lake and asking other churches to join us. Josh has ordered palms for Palm Sunday.

Cemetery – Bud Ozark has been contacted regarding the status of our cemetery survey. He has indicated that the survey is about half done, with another trip planned soon to finish up the last of the headstone locations before finishing the surveying plan.

New Business – Mother's Union at St. Mary's and All Saints are trying to find ways to help with the homeless situation. We can always use lots of socks, mittens and blankets to give out to those in need. Also, they could donate money or food to Martha's Pantry.

Agenda planning for general meeting — We will have to set a number for vestry at the annual meeting. Budget approval by vestry will be at our next regular meeting.

Credit Card for Parish – Paul is exploring having a credit card specifically for the church's use. He will be getting more information.

The meeting closed at 9:07 pm with prayer and the grace.
